The 2023 festival season is over, but the Northern Indiana Bluegrass Association will be busy over the winter. The board has already started reviewing and screening bands for 2024, and, with help from our Indiana Arts Council grant, I think we're going to have a great lineup next year!

As I've mentioned, I really feel like the festival is sort of a "family reunion" to me, where we get to-

gether to share our love of bluegrass and traditional/folk music. Of course, we have the monthly jam sessions at the Southwest Conservation Club in Fort Wayne – these are sort of like when someone from your family drops in for a chat.

These monthly jam sessions are a great opportunity to get together with other folks to swap ideas, or, if you're more of a listener than a picker, a chance to hear some great music and chat with other bluegrass music enthusiasts. It's not easy, with all the normal demands on our time, to make plans to visit with each other, but I think the monthly jam session is a great opportunity to do that. It reminds me of the Bill Monroe song, "Ya'll Come" – sometimes it's hard to work in the jam session, but afterward everyone is glad they did. The next monthly jam will be October 15.

As I look back on the fall festival, I'm really glad that we had Sammy Adkins and the Sandy Hook Mountain Boys – they really brought back the heart and soul of the Stanley Brothers sound, complete with not only vocals in the Stanley style but also hard driving banjo in Ralph's style and lead guitar in George Shuffler's style.

All the groups were great -- there aren't any better than Tony Hale and Blackwater at the traditional style. I was really happy with the diversity in our lineup. Edgar Loudermilk's whole band plays with an enthusiasm that I think will eventually put his original material in the "standard" category.

And, we had Nu Blu on the progressive end of the spectrum, balancing out with Phillip Steinmetz on the roots end.

Lincoln Highway was a good addition to our Thursday/Friday lineup, with their special brand of grass. Bluegrass Pythagoras is really going to be knocking the socks off their fans as they continue to gel as a group, and Calabogie Road gets better every time I see them!

I would be remiss if I didn't mention how happy I am to now include Big Al Weekly as a member of our NIBGA bluegrass family. He drove 8 hours to do a great job of emceeing all day Friday and Saturday!

With 2023 festivals in the rearview mirror (just barely), I'm really excited to see what 2024 is going to look like!
