The NIBGA newsletter is a great place to get info about upcoming concerts and jams. And, of course,

there are NIBGA club jams every month, except December, over winter at the South West Conservation Club at 5703 Bluffton Rd in Fort Wayne.

The club jams are a great way to get out and socialize with other bluegrassers and pick up a few musical ideas. Of course, you never know who will be there and that is part of the fun – if you're a musician, it's interesting, and often challenging, to get in the same groove as folks you don't typically get to play with.

And, if you're a listener, you'll often get treated to sounds that only the energy of a jam session can create. While a jam session isn't polished like a performance, it often produces, out of the sense of reckless abandon created in the energy of the moment, sounds and musical concepts that couldn't live under the scrutiny of a performance. A first or uncommon meeting of musical minds can create that sense of abandon and willingness to experiment.

Before signing off for another month, I want to make mention of the International Bluegrass Music Awards. As I've mentioned before, it is encouraging to me that we see so many young folks who are adopting "bluegrass" as the basis for their signature sound. As far as I'm concerned, how these folks define bluegrass, and the take they have on the genre, is not nearly as important as the enthusiasm and energy they impart on the finished product.

Folks like Trey Hensley and Molly Tuttle are paying great homage to bluegrass music and its history while taking the music to new venues and new fans. How cool is it that we see the bluegrass torch being carried into the future by folks like The Po Ramblin' Boys, Appalachian Road Show, Alison Brown, Billy Strings, Sister Sadie, the Henhouse Prowlers, Brooke Aldridge, Tray Wellington, and Steve Martin? What a wonderful, diverse group of musicians! And these are just a few of the folks nominated this year. Some were winners, while others weren't (at least not this time), but there is no doubt they are all moving our music forward and helping make it pertinent in today's world.
