President's Corner - Joe Steiner



Now that the camper is winterized an put away, it's time to start thinking toward next year's festivals.

I'm really excited about the great bands we have lined up. We are sure grateful for any and all suggestions we receive as far as bands. It doesn't always work out for us to hire all the bands suggested, since there are always more suggestions

than we have slots to fill.

In 2024, though, the NIBGA board suggested that we try to accommodate more requests than in the past. Toward this end, we are having each band perform a fewer number of times than at previous festivals, which opens up slots for additional bands. Although this requires a larger financial commitment (since bands are willing to discount multiple shows at the same location), the board felt strongly that this additional expense was a constructive use of the grant money we have received over the past year.

We always try to work in a variety of music stylistically, from traditional bluegrass to roots and branches in the old-timey and progressive genres, as well as including representation from national, regional, and local bands. Providing this variety brings another set of criteria. If one of your suggested bands isn't hired this year please mention them again, because we may be able to include them in the future.

I am elated many deserving bluegrass artists are very popular with concert audiences today. While this gives us encouragement for the future of the music we love, it also means that the availability of these groups is limited. Each year it is a challenge to book the top national acts, with competition from other events around the U.S. and even foreign tours. This year is no exception; however, we are really proud and excited that we were able to work both High Fidelity and Volume 5 into the lineup, along with lots of other great bands.

I mentioned last time that I'm encouraged by the number of young bluegrass enthusiasts we are seeing these days, and I mentioned several of the younger IBMA award winners, like Molly Tuttle and Trey Hensley. We recently became aware of an organization called Tomorrow's Bluegrass Stars (TBS) which encourages school-age children with an interest in bluegrass by partnering with festivals to provide a central gathering place. These students are throughout all of the United States. And these aren't just "kids learning to play instruments"... these are youngsters that are already making a name for themselves in the music world, showcasing at the Opry, and playing with the heavy hitters of the bluegrass world. I think it will be exciting to host them!
