Although everyone gets a chance to choose a song, there's never any pressure if you just want to stay in the background.

You've got to love a band that takes their name from a 1964 recording of the Kentucky Colonels! Just as Clarence and Roland White, Billy Ray Latham, and Roger Bush were on their classic album on World Pacific Records, the members of **Appalachian Swing** are unabashed in their love for the hard-driving world of bluegrass music. And, just as with the Kentucky Colonels, that is readily apparent in a rather raucous musical style delivered in a very polished context — a feat which can only be accomplished when one learns the subtleties of musical finesse.

They click together perfectly on rhythm, which creates a perfect bed for their vocals and instrumental improvisations. They have all the bases covered -- Adam Schlenker (guitar and vocals), Hayes Griffin (mandolin and vocals), Todd Sams (banjo), and George Welling (bass and vocals) are all top notch instrumentally. And they feature the kind of powerful vocals you expect from a hard-driving bluegrass band. I'm really excited to see this versatile, powerful bluegrass ensemble from central Ohio in person!

My Brother's Keeper, from Cincinnati, OH, is on the progressive side, and they show the influence of multiple genres in their performances. Brothers Benjamin, Titus, and Joshua Luckhaupt on guitar, mandolin, and fiddle, along with Wyatt "Sawmill" Murray on upright bass, are all rock solid, both instrumentally and vocally. Progressive, yes, but there can be no doubt of bluegrass influence in the tightness of their harmonies and instrumental work. This will be their third appearance at Tri-State, and they effuse a soulful approach that has made them a big hit in each of their previous appearances.

Fox Crossing Stringband, from Chicago, Illinois, is a group that features an entertaining stage presence, strong vocal harmonies, some nice original material, and covers of popular songs, all

within a traditional bluegrass context. They feature five bluegrass instruments, although that is accomplished with the three members alternating on multiple instruments throughout their program.

Allison Branch plays guitar, Despina Pafralides alternates between fiddle and mandolin, and Cassie Wright plays dobro and banjo. All three contribute lead and harmony vocals, and originals from all three are featured in their repertoire. There are not a lot of allfemale bluegrass bands, but perhaps Fox Crossing Stringband will inspire a change in that regard!
