I love bluegrass music in all its iterations. I love traditional bluegrass music, performed with heart and soul, with energy and enthusiasm, the way the first generation of bluegrass musicians like Bill Monroe, Lester Flatt, Earl Scruggs, and the Stanley Brothers performed it. But, I also love the roots and branches of bluegrass music – I might go so far as to say that I love ALL roots music and anything remotely related to the sound that Bill Monroe and company created back in the late 1940s.

I say that because it is particularly rewarding for me to experience a group like **Chicken Wire Empire.** They are carrying forward with a sound that obviously has the same roots as those first generation bluegrassers, but they have travelled a different path to get where they are today.

They are obviously bluegrass, and are, as they describe themselves, contemporary. I'd certainly call them progressive. I'd also call them versatile. They are as versatile as you can get, handling a variety of grooves from hard driving bluegrass to swing to blues, and everything in between with equal aplomb.

You've got to have tight vocals to be bluegrass – and they do. Got to have drive – check. Got to have interesting instrumental solos – they've got it in spades! Hot, hot, hot! But, they definitely are forging their own road beyond these critical ingredients. Their web site says they are "fusing traditional roots with innovative, genre-blending elements". Yep!

Hailing from the Milwaukee, Wisconsin area, the band consists of Jordan Kroeger on bass, Ernest Brusubardis IV on fiddle, Jon Peik on banjo, Carter Shilts on mandolin, and Starr Moss on guitar.
