The Spring Tri-State Bluegrass Festival is now behind us, and what a great time it was! Unfortunately, the wet, cold weather early in the week dampened the outdoor picking prospects and had a detrimental effect on the gate during that time. But we still had a nice crowd when the festival arrived. And it was safe to say a good time

was had by all with some great entertainment from energetic bands playing to an enthusiastic audience.

One observation that I had during the festival is that the nature of our attendees has changed over the last few years. We still have a lot of familiar faces that we enjoy seeing at each event, but we also see a lot of new faces and younger faces. That helps us meet a goal of our board to attract younger folks to the festival, to help ensure that the event, which our patrons and volunteers have invested in, continues well into the future.

Years ago, a lot of attendees would arrive earlier during the week, many a week before the festival even started! Younger families can often not arrive as early because of other commitments, and that manifests itself in a larger percentage of our audience arriving later in the week. That's something we'll need to take into account in our future planning and pricing discussions.

I would certainly be remiss if I didn't thank the many, many volunteers who helped out with the festival. I don't have space here to list their names, or even the many functions they perform. But, they are listed elsewhere in this newsletter. We could not hold this festival without volunteer support, since the price would be exorbitant if we needed to hire help for the festival. Keep in mind that everyone you see working at the festival, including the NIBGA board, are volunteers. They are investing their time in the event and its future, simply because of their love for bluegrass music. Thank you, thank you, thank you!

Last, but not least, I want to send out special thanks to our patrons, who are listed elsewhere in the newsletter. These folks help carry us through, because they love and want to support bluegrass music. Other than their membership and a special T-Shirt (which is way cool!), they do not receive anything except the knowledge that they are investing financially in the club and its support of the music we all love. Now to get ready for fall!

My Brother's Keeper was an instant hit the first time they appeared on the Tri-State stage. My first thought on hearing them was, "how can a band without a banjo player be this good?" These guys are solid all the way around! They have soulful lead vocals and top-notch, smooth harmony vocals as well as terrific, creative instrumentals. These are packaged up with a rhythm that is rock solid, but yet flexible and creative enough to introduce the artistic freedom they need to get their message across. And the best part regarding their message is that it's delivered in a package of awesome original material.

They describe themselves as "a progressive bluegrass band" and acknowledge inspiration from rock and gospel music as well as bluegrass; but on hearing them you will not doubt that their foundation is on the syncopation and improvisation of bluegrass. The group consists of Benjamin Luckhaupt (guitar), Titus Luckhaupt (mandolin), and Joshua Luckhaupt (fiddle), Wyatt "Sawmill" Murray (upright bass), and Adam Moehlman (fiddle). All are crazy good. And, to top it all off, they also have a comfortable, yet energetic stage presence. The banjo? OK, I guess you don't miss it that much!

Sammy Adkins and the Sandy Hook Mountain Boys play music in the harddriving Stanley-style as well as anyone I have ever heard. No doubt that is partly due to Sammy's previous association as lead singer with the man, Ralph Stanley, himself. It takes a lot of talent and finesse to get just the right amount of attack and edge to handle that style – in the right hands, the music clicks together and barrels ahead like a freight train. But, as Sammy deftly demonstrates, the train is under complete control, kept on the tracks by solid rhythm, fiery instruments, and fantastic vocals (with just the right amount of "edge" of course). In the wrong hands, the train can derail quickly (which is why groups performing that style aren't more common), but you never have to worry about that with the Sandy Hook Mountain Boys!
