BUZZ on the BANDS

In addition to the bands mentioned in previous newsletters, there will be something for everyone on the Memorial Day lineup.

The West Liberty Mountain Boys, from Eastern Kentucky deliver up solid, hard-driving traditional grass, but featuring some nice originals as well as covers from the classic repertory.

Also on the traditional side, we have 7 Mile Bluegrass and Cedar Creek returning to our stage this spring.

At the other end of the spectrum, the Debutants, hailing from right in our own backyard in Fort Wayne, have a more progressive approach but are as rock-solid an outfit as you can get, both vocally and instrumentally – their musicianship has always been awesome and it just keeps getting better.

A special treat in the spring will be seeing Kentucky Blue again, after too many years. Dave and Laurie Cottrell and their find band have been mainstays of the festival for many years, and, given Dave's abundant talents and propensity for onstage antics, have also been one of our most entertaining acts.

The Watershed Ramblers, from Chesterton, IN are on the progressive end of the spectrum, featuring a unique approach to acoustic music and original material.


The Sugar Mules are full of personality, billing themselves as
