They have a comfortable, welcoming stage presence and an original approach that definitely reaches toward the future more so than living in the past. Paul Brown (banjo) is the original organizer of the group, and it features John Victor on harmonica, Richard Moore on guitar, Bryan Joseph on mandolin, and Nick Weiland on bass.

Blue Diggity is one of the hottest young bands in bluegrass. Hailing from Wheeling, West Virginia, they feature tight vocals, but they are just as impressive with their creative instrumental work. They have some great interpretations of classic bluegrass numbers as well as some great original material, and they also occasionally pull in some nice interpretations of numbers from other genres. But you can tell from their high-energy program that the root of their sound, and the soul of their music, is from the first generation bluegrass well. The band consists of Isaiah Childers on guitar, Bailey Childers on banjo, Lilli Gadd on bass, and Jimmy Hall on mandolin.
